Catholic Charities Bureau Statement of Philosophy


Catholic Charities has since 1917 been providing services to the poor and disadvantaged as an expression of the social ministry of the Catholic Church in the Diocese of Superior.

Code Of Ethics

Code I:


The Backyard Buddies Room helps children 4 & 5 years old learn kindergarten readiness skills and tools to be successful in school.


